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## "Sentiment Analysis of Netizen through Youtube comment in the Digital Age: An Analysis of Tribal Videos on Gujjar Bakkarwal"

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### Abstract:

This study explores sentiment analysis of netizens' reactions through YouTube comments, focusing on tribal videos related to the Gujjar Bakkarwal community in the Digital Age. With the rise of digital platforms as major sites for communication, YouTube has become an essential space for the expression of opinions and emotions regarding various socio-cultural topics. The Gujjar Bakkarwal community, a historically marginalized tribal group in India, has been increasingly represented in digital media, often sparking varied online sentiments. This research employs a content analysis approach to examine YouTube comments on videos featuring the Gujjar Bakkarwal tribe, aiming to identify dominant themes of sentiment, including positivity, negativity, and neutrality. By analyzing the textual data using sentiment analysis tools and manual coding, the study investigates how digital discourse reflects public perceptions of the tribe and its cultural representation in contemporary media. The findings offer insights into the complexities of online identity formation, the role of digital media in shaping public opinion, and the influence of social platforms on cultural narratives in the context of indigenous communities. This research contributes to the broader understanding of tribal representation, and online sentiment in the Digital Age.

### Introduction:

In recent decades, the rise of new media has revolutionized how stories are told, shared, and preserved. For indigenous communities, this digital shift offers a unique opportunity to reclaim their narratives, preserve their traditions, and ensure that their voices are heard in an increasingly globalized world. Historically, indigenous tribes have relied on oral traditions and face-to-face storytelling as means of passing down knowledge, customs, and cultural identity. ### Objectives

1. To analyze the sentiment of YouTube comments on videos featuring the Gujjar Bakkarwal community.
2. The goal is to determine how YouTube comments reflect broader societal views and the potential influence of online content.

### Research Methodology:

To investigate how indigenous tribes related content on digital media (such as social media platforms, podcasts, and YouTube) to share their stories and preserve their traditions received by netizens, this research will manually analyse comments on the Youtube videos. The methodology content analysis will be employed, to provide a comprehensive understanding of the topic. Below is a detailed outline of the research methodology.

### Selection of Content:

**Sampling:** Purposive sampling was used to select the videos and comments for analysis. The comments section of each video served as the primary unit of analysis, with each comment treated as a single data point. Comments posted within the last three months (i.e. February 2025 to April 2025) were analysed to capture the most recent public engagement.

The content will be analysed for authenticity, audience engagement (e.g., comments, shares, likes), and the potential impact on wider public awareness of indigenous issues through comments, likes, views etc.

Analysing Impact on Public Awareness:

**Visibility and Reach:** Analyse the reach of the content. For example, are certain hashtags or topics becoming trending or viral?

**Engagement Metrics:** Quantify how many likes, shares, comments, or reactions each post, video, or podcast receives. This can help measure how well the content resonates with the audience.

**Limitations:** One limitation of this research is that given the rapidly evolving nature of digital platforms, the research may capture a snapshot of media use that may change over time. Furthermore, the diversity among indigenous communities means that the findings of this study may not be universally applicable to all tribes or nations.

**Expected Outcomes:**

The research is expected to reveal how indigenous communities content on digital media platforms provide insights into the ways in which digital storytelling helps to foster cultural pride, build solidarity, and amplify indigenous voices in a global context. By combining these methods, the research will offer an understanding of netizens and their perception related with the same.

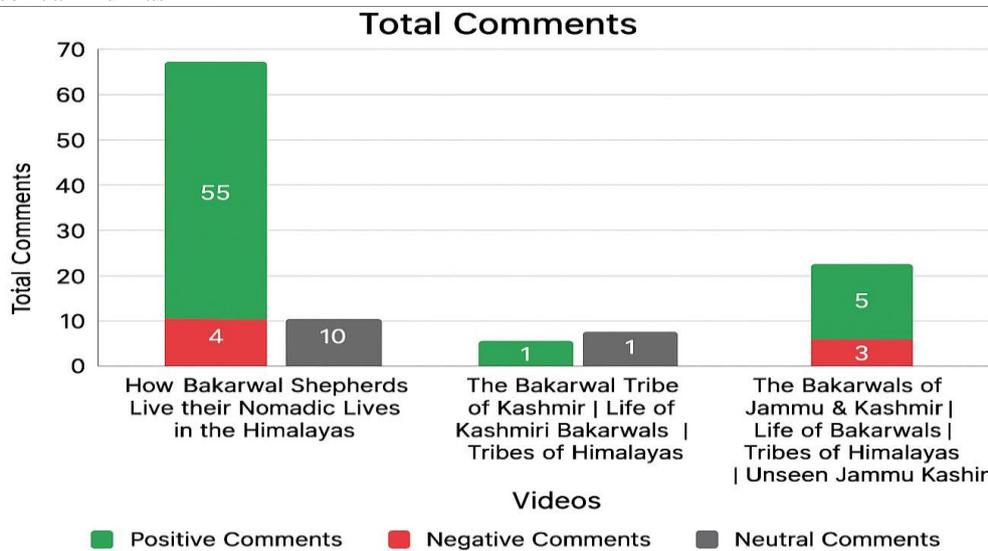

The bar graph illustrates the distribution of positive, negative, and neutral comments across three videos focusing on the Bakarwal community of Jammu and Kashmir. The first video, “How Bakarwal Shepherds Live their Nomadic Lives in the Himalayas,” received the highest number of comments overall, with a total of 69 comments. Among these, a significant majority were positive (55 comments), followed by 10 neutral and only 4 negative comments, indicating a highly favorable audience response. The second video, “The Bakarwal Tribe of Kashmir | Life of Kashmiri Bakarwals | Tribes of Himalayas,” had very limited engagement, totaling just 3 comments — 2 positive and 1 neutral — and no negative feedback, suggesting a small but generally positive reception. Similarly, the third video, “The Bakarwals of Jammu & Kashmir | Life of Bakarwals | Tribes of Himalayas | Unseen Jammu Kashmir,” garnered 8 comments, with 5 positive, 3 neutral, and no negative comments. Overall, the bar graph highlights that across all three videos, the positive sentiment dominates, with very few negative remarks, reflecting an overall appreciative audience attitude toward the content on the Bakarwal lifestyle.

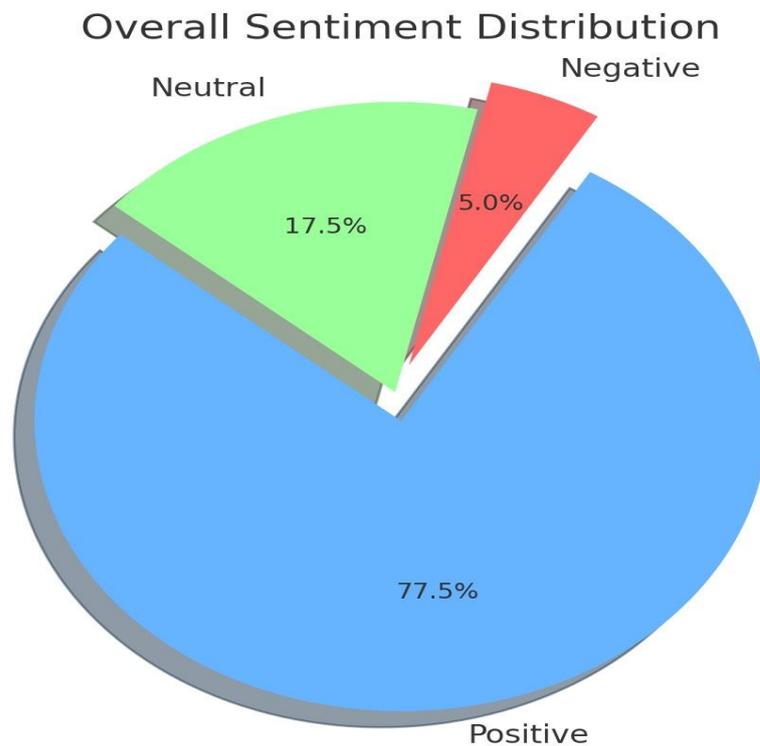

A few comments express interest in further engagement, particularly with the request for more videos on the Bakarwal tribe.

The pie chart presents the overall sentiment distribution of comments gathered from all three videos about the Bakarwal community. It clearly shows that positive comments overwhelmingly dominate, making up the majority of the total feedback. Neutral comments form a smaller, but still notable portion, while negative comments represent only a minimal fraction of the overall responses. This visual breakdown indicates that viewers largely reacted favorably to the videos, expressing appreciation and support, with very little criticism or dissatisfaction. The high proportion of positive sentiment suggests that the portrayal of the Bakarwal lifestyle resonated well with the audience, generating empathy, interest, and admiration.

**Key Findings:**

1. **Cultural Pride & Identity:** Viewers express strong pride in the Bakarwal and nomadic communities' heritage, highlighting the need for cultural preservation amid modernization. The ethnic and religious identity of these groups, especially the Gujjar-Bakarwals, is a significant discussion point.
2. **Impact of Modernization:** Urbanization and industrialization are seen as threats to traditional nomadic lifestyles. Younger generations face economic challenges due to a disconnect from traditional ways and limited job opportunities.
3. **Environmental Concerns:** There's a focus on the environmental sustainability of nomadic practices, with concerns about deforestation, climate change, and the loss of natural landscapes.
4. **Role of Digital Media:** Digital platforms allow nomadic communities to connect globally, share cultural knowledge, and promote cross-cultural awareness, fostering cultural pride and solidarity.
5. **Preservation of Heritage:** There is a call for preserving the cultural practices of nomadic communities, with suggestions for exploring more regions to understand their diversity. This measure how well the content resonates with the audience.

**Conclusion**

The analysis of YouTube comments on videos featuring the Gujjar Bakarwal community reveals a predominantly positive and respectful sentiment towards the lifestyle, culture, and struggles of the community. The comments reflect admiration for the Bakarwal's nomadic way of life, with many viewers expressing emotional resonance and cultural connection, particularly from individuals with shared heritage. Positive remarks highlight the cinematic quality of the documentaries and show deep appreciation for the Bakarwals' traditions and values. Some comments also reflect pride in the Gujjar identity, underscoring a sense of solidarity within the community. Additionally, there are calls for social and political advocacy, with viewers urging the government to provide better support for the Bakarwal community, including land rights and necessary infrastructure.

However, the analysis also reveals the presence of negative sentiments, including prejudice and political tensions. A small minority of comments expressed stereotyping views or made politically charged statements, reflecting broader societal divides. These negative remarks, though present, are significantly outweighed by the overall positivity and respect shown towards the Bakarwal tribe. There is also a notable trend of curiosity and inquisitive sentiment, comment also shows cultural pride, with many users asking technical questions or showing interest in learning more about the community and its customs.

In conclusion, the sentiment of YouTube comments largely aligns with positive societal views of the Bakarwal tribe, showcasing admiration, cultural pride, and advocacy for their rights. The influence of online content appears to foster a greater appreciation for this marginalized community, while also raising awareness about the challenges they face. Although there is some negative or politically charged content, it is relatively isolated compared to the overwhelmingly supportive feedback, indicating the potential of such videos to positively shape public perceptions and drive conversations around social justice and cultural preservation.

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
